RESOLUTION NO. 2025-73

A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION COMPETITIVE FUNDING PROPOSAL (“CFP”) PROGRAM FOR TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES (“TA”) AND CONGESTION MITIGATION AND AIR QUALITY (“CMAQ”) FOR THE EAST KING STREET REALIGNMENT PROJECT; TO PROVIDE FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING RESOLUTIONS; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) has announced the availability of funding through its Competitive Funding Proposal (CFP) Program, which includes Transportation Alternatives (TA) and Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funding to support transportation projects that enhance safety, improve mobility, and promote multimodal connectivity across the state; and,

WHEREAS, the East King Street Realignment Project has been identified by the City of Hampton as a priority transportation improvement that will realign the existing intersection of East King Road, Rosenwald Drive, and McDonough Street to improve safety, and accessibility; and,

WHEREAS, the project is consistent with the City of Hampton’s adopted Livable Centers Initiative (LCI) Plans, the King, George, and Daniel Streets Revitalization Strategy, and the Henry County Transportation Plan, all of which emphasize multimodal safety and connectivity; and


WHEREAS, the City of Hampton has the legal authority and the institutional, managerial, and financial capacity to ensure compliance with GDOT program requirements, including providing the required twenty percent (20%) local match if the grant is awarded; and

WHEREAS, in the event of a successful grant award, the City may enter into a grant agreement with the Georgia Department of Transportation for the implementation of the East King Street Realignment Project and will comply with all applicable federal and state laws, regulations, and contract conditions.

BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Hampton, Georgia, that the City hereby authorizes the submission of an application to the Georgia Department of Transportation Competitive Funding Proposal (CFP) Program for Transportation Alternatives (TA) and Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funding for the East King Street Realignment Project and commits to providing the required twenty percent (20%) local funding match if the grant is awarded.


